# **Executive Summary**

### Women Inspire Forum 2023

In honor and celebration of International Women's Day 2023, the Casa Foundation for International Development hosted the 4th edition of Women in Business and Leadership Women Inspire Forum on the 10th of March 2023 at Toronto Region Board of Trade Ballroom, Toronto.

#### **Theme**

The theme for this year is Embrace Equity: Enabling young women to rise to boards and top leadership. The theme focuses on acknowledging the efforts and impact made by women leaders in various sectors and industries in Canada as well as educating and building more opportunities for professional women and women entrepreneurs to take up the leadership mantle and make a difference for the society.

### **Forum Objective**

The Women Inspire Forum focused on celebrating International Women's Day in 2023 by recognizing women leaders' efforts in enabling and advocating for equity in various sectors and industries in Canada. The event hosted a dialogue to address gaps and the future of gender equality in leadership roles where women are underrepresented.

The Women Inspire Forum included a panel sessions, business roundtable, a case study of leading women pioneers in their respective trades, keynote opening statements from senior government officials, as well as speakers from various industry sectors that impacted lives or helped in fast-tracking innovation and growth in the trade, education, and entrepreneurship sectors.

The event enabled, empowered, and promoted women in business, enterprises, careers, and leadership, providing a unique platform that gave established start-ups, professionals, innovators, emerging businesses, inventors, and creators across various sectors the opportunity to discuss their ideas with expert panels and founders from business, corporate, and academic fields. The Women Inspire Forum welcomed about 150 women-owned businesses and startups, where participants met women who were changing the world as entrepreneurs, practitioners, women leaders, and influencers. Other expected participants included creative collaborators, partners, youths in established businesses, those looking to start a product or service, or pioneers with women's businesses.

Women Inspire hosts Women in Business, Entrepreneurship, Trade, and Leaders across a broad spectrum in Partnership with other Corporate, Non-Profit, and Public Organizations that promote, advance, and Empower Women.

Women Inspire focuses on women that advance trade, business, entrepreneurship, and the economic development landscape. It also celebrates Women who Inspire others and have distinguished themselves in business, leadership, and trade sectors. The Forum's sole purpose is to support women-owned businesses while empowering women to run businesses through connecting resources (social, capital, human) to ideas.

The Women Inspire Forum was organized in the form of a business roundtable, a case study of leading women pioneers in their respective trades, keynote opening statements from Senior Government officials, as well as speakers from various industry sectors that have impacted lives or who have helped in fast-tracking innovation and growth in the trade, education, and entrepreneurship sectors have also shared their insightful experiences.

#### **EVENT SUMMARY**

To make the event effective and meet its intended purpose, various committees such as event organizing, and program coordinating, media & IT committees were established. Besides, various partners were also involved in carrying out the forum.

The event is handled by forming 3 panels and 18 Speakers are drawn from senior leadership of corporate Canada from both the public and private sectors. Through these panel sessions and Case-studies, Women executives from vertical sectors (Government, academia, business, banking, real estate, non-profits, and charities), have shared impressive thoughts supported by empirical pieces of evidence on how to succeed in a career, trade, or business in a challenging arena focusing mainly on the following discussion topics:

- 1. Empowering Women; Case Studies of Women in business, leadership. Sharing the journey.
- 2. How do Women Create Sustainable Wealth?
- 3. Enabling Women to rise to Boards and Top Leadership of Corporations

During the panel session, participants raised numerous questions and thorough discussions were made to address the issues.



### **EVENT OUTCOME**

The Women Inspire Forum held on International Women's Day 2023 successfully brought together women leaders from various sectors and industries in Canada to address the gaps and future of gender equality in leadership roles. The event, which featured three panels, focused on empowering women in business, creating sustainable wealth, and enabling women to rise to boards and top leadership positions in corporations.

The panel discussions were a huge success, with about 150 delegates from all over Canada participating in the insightful conversations and gaining knowledge from the expert panels and founders from business, corporate, and academic fields. Out of the 246 registered participants, 156 (63.41%) attended the forum in person, and all the speakers shared their valuable insights and practices with the participants



#### **1ST PANEL - A ROUNDTABLE DISCUSSION**

### TOPIC: EMPOWERING WOMEN; CASE STUDIES OF WOMEN IN BUSINESS, LEADERSHIP. SHARING THE JOURNEY

The first panel, "Case Studies of Entrepreneurs," featured Sarah Syed, Founder of You Are the Change, Tosin During, Co-Founder of Beauty, Braids and Beyond, and Eloisa Slimmon, Founder of Liberty Movement & Wellness. The panelists shared their experiences and lessons learned as successful women entrepreneurs and how they overcame challenges to grow their businesses sustainably.







### DISCUSSION PANEL 2: HOW DO WOMEN CREATE SUSTAINABLE WEALTH?

The goal of these session was to help women develop a strong network of peers and mentors who can provide support, advice, and guidance throughout their careers and businesses. By connecting with other women in their field, participants can gain valuable insights, access new opportunities, and build lasting relationships that can help them succeed.







### LESSONS LEARNED AND RECOMMENDATIONS

This forum has brought a golden opportunity to pay tribute to the inspirational women who are playing a vital role in the economy and societies. The participants have gained much knowledge and experience from the thoughtful and inspiring presentations made by the speakers, as well as the participative discussions and networking held.

One of the key takeaways from the forum was the importance of financial investments for building a legacy. It was noted that women are often underrepresented in fields that require significant financial investments, which limits their ability to build a legacy and contribute to their communities. The forum highlighted the need for more financial resources and investment opportunities for women-led businesses and initiatives.

Additionally, the lessons learned from undertaking such a forum are that it is essential in upgrading the knowledge and skills of women, and that there is still a wide gap to be filled. Women, whether they are engaged in business or employed, are keen to get such opportunities for knowledge sharing and development. Moreover, there are many experienced professionals and scholars who are willing to do their utmost to enhance the capacity of women, thereby impacting the well-being of society at large.

To ensure the continued success of such forums, it is recommended that they be held regularly to sign up a significant number of participants. Follow-ups and long-term impact assessments should be made to evaluate their effectiveness. Partnerships with organizations and individuals who appreciate and support such forums are essential, as they have a significant impact on enhancing the capacity of women to sustainably lead businesses and contribute to society. Moreover, such forums should be intended to create a women's network that strengthens women's participation within the community and builds new skills and mindsets.
